The North Olympic Volunteer Program (NOVC), supports volunteers who are under 55 or who are working at non-RSVP identified sites. RSVP partner sites include OlyCAPs: Encore, Early Childhood Services, Senior Nutrition, Home Fund, and Vet Connect. Community partners are: ECHHO, Volunteer Services, area food banks, Port Angeles School District, Olympic Peninsula Boys & Girls Club. NOVC partner agencies include: Clallam County Law Library, and KSQM Radio.
